Some loaner gear is available for use. Bring your own gear if you have it.





Volunteers face freezing temperatures to help save stunned sea turtles



<u>Gulf Center for Sea Turtle Research</u> and partners came together to rescue several stranded sea turtles coldstunned by the recent winter weather along the upper Texas coast. We want to thank everyone involved for their help in rescuing these turtles!

Cold temperatures could continue in February. If you see a stranded sea turtle in the Park, on the bayside, or in the Gulf, call **1-866-TURTLE-5** so the turtle can be assisted & and rescued by trained personnel.

Every turtle found is transported and then processed by the Gulf Center for Sea Turtle Research team. Every attempt is made to save and release the turtle back to the Gulf.
